## KEYNOTE SPEAKER

### Martin Matthews



One of the key decision-makers in transport from New Zealand will address Roads Congress this year. Local roads underpin the freight movement and productivity of our nation. Effective road financing and appropriate asset management are critical to the successful management of our local roads.

Martin Matthews brings a wealth of knowledge from his eight years as the Secretary of Transport in NZ, responsible for advice to the government on policy, regulation and investment across all modes of transport. During this time, he encouraged the Ministry to take a more strategic long term view about the future of mobility and transport, and the role that technology will play in bringing about a paradigm shift in the coming decades.

The Congress will hear directly from Martin on his insights into how "Governments and roading agencies need to get their heads around the opportunities to solve transport public policy challenges in completely different ways."

## HEAVY VEHICLE MANOEUVRING DEMONSTRATION

On Wednesday 9 November a heavy vehicle demonstration will be provided to increase the awareness among councilors and council staff of the productivity and safety features of high productivity heavy vehicles. Delegates will gain an appreciation of the enhanced manoeuvring, access and safety capability that high productivity vehicles can provide. There will be a variety of higher productivity heavy vehicles running through their paces. This demonstration, accompanied by expert commentary, will also assist the certainty with which councils can make decisions about access to their local road networks. High productivity heavy vehicles can deliver the same amount of freight with the added benefit of reduced emissions, fewer trips and lower impact on local roads.

The demonstration is being hosted by Toowoomba Regional Council in partnership with the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator, industry participants, the Local Government Association of Queensland and ALGA.
