- ✓ Bucket, plastic
- ✓ Cardboard (not waxed or soiled)
- ✓ Cards
- Cereal boxes

- ✓ Clean paper
- ✓ Computer paper
- ✓ Deodorant cans (empty)
- ✓ Detergent bottles
- ✓ Detergent boxes
- ✓ Drink cans
- ✓ Egg cartons
- Envelopes/window envelopes
- ✓ Foil (clean & scrunched)

- ✓ Glass jars
- Hard plastics
- Household cleaning product bottles (empty)

- ✓ Jar lids
- ✓ Junk mail
- ✓ Letters
- Magazines
- Meat trays, hard plastic (not foam)
- Milk bottle lids (if placed inside plastic milk bottle)
- ✓ Milk cartons/bottles

- Newspaper
- ✓ Notepads
- Pet food tins
- √ Phone books
- ✓ Plant pots (plastic)
- ✓ Plastic plates and cutlery

- ✓ Plastic food containers (eg. ice cream, margarine, yoghurt)
- Hard plastics (no soft plastic wrap)
- √ Shampoo bottles
- ✓ Steel cans
- Takeaway coffee lids (plastic)
- Takeaway containers, plastic
- √ Tetra paks
- ✓ Wine bottles
- ✓ Wine cask box
- Wrapping paper

Empty liquids out of bottles and scape food from containers and tins before placing in your yellow lidded bin.
