Introduction

In the past 4-years the Council has engaged and worked with residents and local business on the development of Town Landscape Master Plans. Each Master Plan identifies what is unique about each town: its people, open spaces, heritage, lifestyle and values. Furthermore, our Town Landscape Masterplan infrastructure projects are projects designed to added to the livability, attractiveness and amenity of our towns.

Included in this community engagement report are projects which have been identified as part of our Town Landscape Master Planning program also projects identified by local sports clubs and the Council. All projects included in the Council's most recent poll of residents are projects designed to improve the quality of life for local residents, business and visitors to our towns.

For the most part the projects identify by local sports clubs and the Council are projects which if the redevelopment of an existing asset, relate to assets that do not meet contemporary standards. And if a new asset or substantially new development that will create a new asset the need has been identified by local communities as part of the Berrigan Shire Council's rolling program of community engagement. Adding weight to consultation undertaken by the Council as part of its Customer Satisfaction Survey (Nexus 2015) and its (2016) review of Berrigan Shire Community Strategic Plan 2023 and the development (2017) of the Berrigan Shire Community Strategic Plan 2027.

Community Engagement

Customer and Business Satisfaction Survey

Nexus Research were engaged by the Council 2015 to conduct a Customer and Business Satisfaction Survey. The results of this survey are used by Council Officers to inform Asset Service Levels and to also 'test' qualitative feedback received by the Council, supplemental to community engagement undertaken and described in the following Council Plans and Strategies:

- <u>Children, Young People and their Families Strategy 2015 2019</u> (Facilities and Infrastructure used by families e.g.: playgrounds, sports grounds and recreation reserves)
- Pedestrian and Access Mobility Plans Tocumwal and Finley
- Town Concept Landscape Masterplans (Barooga, Finley and Tocumwal)

Stronger Country Communities Round 1 Poll

In 2017 a three week (24/7/17 - 12/8/2017) online poll was conducted by the Council. Included in this poll were a number of projects which were funded from Round 1 of the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities fund. Namely, the

- Challenge Playground, Barooga Stage 1
- Netball Courts, Berrigan
- Skate Park, Finley; and
- Library Extension, Tocumwal

At that time the Council nominated projects that had community support, that could not be scheduled as part of the Council's forward capital works program and on the basis that each town should benefit from the funds on offer.

Not funded in the previous Stronger Communities Round and were the following two projects:

- Walking Paths, Tocumwal; and
- Change-rooms for Rugby and Soccer at the Finley Showgrounds.

These two projects were strongly supported and consequently included in the Council's Round 2 poll. Not included in the Round 2 poll are the two projects that generated the least amount of community support: the Half-Court Basketball Court (Berrigan) and the construction f at the Barooga Botanical Gardens of a stage.




Figure 1: Round 1 Stronger Country Communities Poll Results


The Council conducted an online poll (3/4/18 - 20/4/18) as an indicator of community support for and relative priority. Included in this poll were the following projects:

- Tocumwal Recreation Reserve Timekeepers box, new scoreboard, refurbishment of Cricket / Netball Changerooms and associated facilities
- Finley Railway Park
- Barooga Foreshore Stage 2-3 Adventure Playground, and Lions Park
- Tocumwal Historic Aerodrome Museum

Overall poll results confirm that all projects selected have community support. This accounts for the likelihood that projects lower ranked projects Finley Walking Track, Finley Railway Park and Barooga Lions Park are less likely to have broad appeal. The refurbishment of the Tocumwal Recreation Reserve – netball / cricket changerooms, time keepers box was ranked highest by survey respondents. Followed by walking track in (Tocumwal)and the development of an Adventure Park at Barooga.

Poll results suggested that there is still strong community support for the Walking Tracks (Tocumwal) and the Refurbishment of Old Changerooms at Finley: the two projects that received extensive community support in Council's 2017 Poll of resident preferences / priorities.

As not all projects can or should be funded based on the comments provided by poll respondents – five distinct themes emerged. Namely there is community support for:

- 1. Sports facilities i.e.: that meet contemporary standards for safety and amenity
- 2. Facilities for families with children (not sport)
- 3. Safe walking paths
- 4. Preservation of Tocumwal's Aerodrome Museum
- 5. Projects sports, recreation or family focused that would attract visitors

Berrigan Shire residents are being encouraged to have their say on how Stronger Country Communities funding allocated to the council is spent.

Council has been awarded up to \$1.4 million for round two of the NSW Government funding stream, with half specifically assigned to sporting infrastructure.

Council has identified a number of potential projects based on the contents of its Barooga, Berrigan, Finley and Tocumwal Town Plans.

All projects included in the plan have been identified through consultation with local communities.

Proposed projects to be put forward for the Stronger Country Communities funding include refurbishment of recreation facilities, the development and implementation of Landscape Master Plans and the development of more Active Communities walking paths.

Council is also proposing some of the money go to the Tocumwal Historic Aerodrome Museum and Barooga Adventure Park projects.

Recreational facility refurbishments proposed include:


Replacement of the Berrigan pool concourse, pool fencing and the construction of a new amenities block

Installation of LED lighting for Berrigan football training and an electronic scoreboard at the Berrigan Sports Ground

The refurbishment of the dilapidated change rooms and kiosk at Finley Showgrounds and Sporting Complex.

Replacement of the Jim Cullen scoreboard, timekeepers' box and its scoreboards at Tocumwal in addition to improving cricket player and spectator comfort via the extension of the verandah, installation of air-conditioner, and kitchen upgrade as part of the renovation of the cricket changerooms


